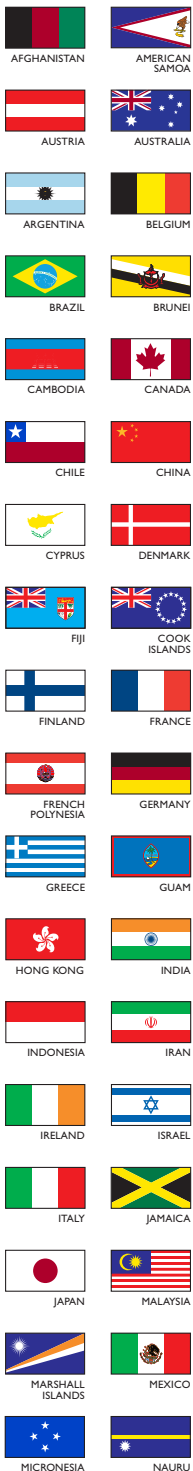


# Design a new New Zealand flag

## Student Entry Form



### CRITERIA

Flags are normally viewed from a distance. When displayed outdoors from flagpoles, they may be fully extended by strong wind or gently flapping in the breeze. They must be easily recognisable and, as you can see from the national flags illustrated, simple bold designs consisting of a limited number of bright solid colours are most effective.

Flags flown in New Zealand (and in many other countries) are 2:1 in proportion. The image on them appears on both sides, positive on the front side when it is flying from left to right, and in 'mirror reverse' on the other.

Entries must be submitted on this form, using the template provided, by 12 November 2004. Each entry must be accompanied by a school entry form. (one per school)
